Brush lettering is a beautiful way of giving your letters a bit more weight and elegance, but it can be hard tolearn without any guidance. That's why we've made these worksheets.



You'll also fins a page with different words that might come in handy when you're using your Pentel Brush Sign Pen to make cards or labels.


Once you get the method incorporated in your hand, the possibilities are endless!


The Pentel Brush Sign Pen have a small but flexile tip that'll produce thick or thin lines, depending on how hard you press it against the paper. Try it out!



When it comes to writing letters, the brush pens are used with this guide.

Every line that you write that goes up, or to the side: Keep them as thin as possible by **decreasing the amount of pressure** on the pen.

The lines that go down are made as thick as possible by increasing the pressure on the pen.



With that rule in mind, it's time to start writing letters. Keep in mind to write them much slower than you normally do, otherwise your brain - hand connection will not have a chance to upgrade accordingly.

The arrows shows the writing direction and where to start.

With rounded and curved lines, you'll have to increase or decrease the pressure as you go - which is a why writing slowly is so important.

On the following two sides you find the whole alphabet, numbers and some words in gray, so that you can trace them in order to learn.
